Permaculture: building health from the ground up

We will explore how observation guides thoughtful design, and how we can simultaneously meet our human needs while building the health of the land and our communities. **Shades of Green** is a sustainable landscape design and installation firm with offices in Atlanta, GA and Asheville, NC. We design and build productive and vibrant landscapes that provide organic food, thriving habitats, herbal medicine, natural beauty, healthy and chemical-free soils, and water sovereignty.

Practical Permaculture in Mississippi

The methods of permaculture can be applied to anything from flowers to food. Jared will discuss how he and his family have used permaculture principles in their own backyard, using it in everything from general landscape design to raising livestock. This course will explain how you can take the concepts behind permaculture and apply them practically, in your own yard - no matter the size. Jared Stanley and his family live in Toomsuba, MS, where they have raised several varieties of crops and animals for their own self-reliance. Jared completed the Permaculture Research Institute of Australia's Permaculture Design Course in 2014, and took the Master Gardener's Course in 2015. He produces videos on YouTube that assist new gardeners with tips and examples gained through his families experiences.

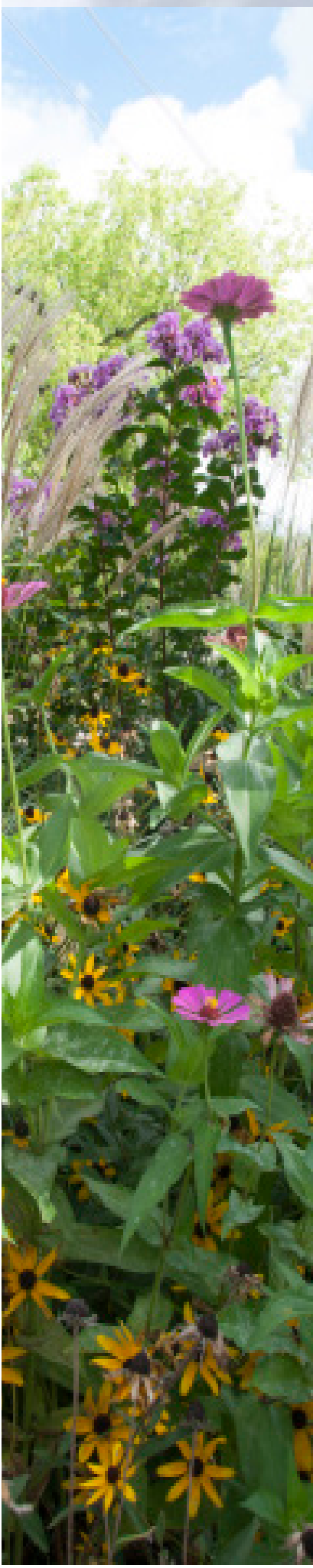

Edward C. Martin, Jr., was born in Albany, Georgia and studied landscape architecture and historic preservation at the University of Georgia. After working a few years in landscape architecture offices he was hired in 1959 as head of campus landscape at Mississippi State University. He began teaching the first landscape design classes at Mississippi State which became the Department of Landscape Architecture. Mr. Martin initiated the annual Landscape Design Symposium for the Garden Clubs of Mississippi, Inc., which he conducted for 50 years and which now bears his name. Ed had taught hundreds of students in landscape architecture until he retired as professor emeritus in 1993, and he moved to the mountains of North Carolina with his wife Roberta. There in Asheville he continued to give tours at Biltmore Estates and in Europe. Mr. Martin had authored two books, including *Landscape Plants in Design* and *Home Landscapes: Planting, Design and Management*; and two unpublished titles *Biltmore Estates* and *A Low Maintenance Home Landscape of A Landscape Architect*. Martin was a Fellow of the American Society of Landscape Architects and was the first registered landscape architect in Mississippi.
